

O Loan for High School Education in Saitama Prefecture

- This is an interest-free loan to assist with costs associated with studying at senior high school.
- As this is a loan, the student is required to repay the full amount following graduation from senior high school.
- A co-signer is not required for this loan. <u>If the student applies in their third year of junior high school,</u> payments can be received prior to entering senior high school.

o Eligibility Criteria

Students must meet all of the following criteria to be eligible to apply.

- The student is currently attending a senior high school, or is a third year junior high school student who intends to progress to senior high school
- · The student's carer resides in Saitama Prefecture
- The student exhibits excellent conduct and is highly motivated in their studies*1, and is experiencing financial hardship*2 that has impacted their education
- *1 The student will require a referral from the principal of their current school.
- *2 The income standard is based on an annual household income of no more than 8,300,000 yen for a four-person household (single income (salaried income only), one senior high school student (16 years and older), and one junior high school student).



• Regarding Repayment

Repayment Period: 12 years (beginning 4 years and 6 months after graduation) Interest: Interest-free (However, late repayment will result in additional fees.)

Application Period and How to Apply

When you receive the payment will vary depending on when you apply. If you would like to apply, please obtain an application from the junior or senior high school you are currently attending, and submit the required documents (application form, tax declaration certificate, official copy of your family register, etc.) to the address specified within the application period.
